WCTEC Continues to Expand


Over the past few months, WCS maintenance has been working hard to prepare the new rooms for the Health Science: Diagnostic Services and Electrical programs for 2019-2020.

The Health Science: Diagnostic Services will provide students who have an interest in the medical field the opportunity to take courses such as Medical Terminology, Phlebotomy Skills, and Electrocardiograph Technician. Partnered with courses from WVNCC, students could graduate with their Patient Care Technician Certificate through WVNCC. After graduation, students can then enroll in any number of medical fields. This program is available to Juniors and Seniors. ***This year only*** Any Senior who is interested in going into the medical field can attend WCTEC in the afternoon.

The Electrical Technician Program focuses on careers that will build a knowledge base and technical skills in all aspects of the Electrical Trades industry. Ultimately, Electrical Technician students will be preparing to take the Journeyman Electrician Exam. Opportunities through WVNCC are also available with this program. The Electrical Technician Lab will be equipped with 12 student booths, as shown in the photo.

This year only Any Senior who is interested in going into the Electrical industry can attend WCTEC in the afternoon.







WCS Mobile Meals- Bringing Summer Meals to Children!

Throughout the summer, WCS has been running three Mobile Meals routes in addition to our school -based summer food locations. These locations are chosen based on where children could gather during the summer. Many sites have playgrounds, or a covered eating area.

The Hundred Route stops at Littleton Church of Christ, Hundred Pool, Hundred Library, and Burton Park

The Short Line Route stops at Reader Park, Reader Methodist Church, VHS, Pine Grove Library, Jacksonburg VFD, Smithfield Park, and Quinn's Ol' Barn General Store.

The Riverfront Route stops at Lewis Wetzel Park, Magnolia High School, Paden City High School, and Paden City Library.

The annual **Kid**Strong conference was held in mid-June in Charleston. Some of our school counselors, school social workers, school resource officers, school nurses, teachers, and administrators attended. This conference is highly regarded across the state. There are a variety of learning tracks and resources offered for a multitude of job classifications within the school system. It is held at the newly renovated Charleston Civic Center and is attended by many hundreds of school employees across the state each school year.

2018-19 End-of-Year Student Data

As we prepare to begin the 2019-20 school year, here is some data for the school year which just ended. Our end of the year enrollment was 2,531. Attendance rate for the county was 93%. Paden City Elementary had the highest rate for the elementary/middle schools, whereas Paden City High School had the highest rate of the high schools, and the county as a whole. Graduation rate always runs a year behind and is not finalized until the middle of the next school year. However, our graduation rate has been over 90% each year since 2012. Our highest was over 96% in the 2017-18 school year. Additionally, our county graduation rate has been 5-10% higher than the state average in the same time period, while our drop-out rate has been less than 1% for eight consecutive school years.

Students from the Hundred, Magnolia, and Pine Grove FFA Chapters attended the 91st WV State FFA Convention, held at Cedar Lakes Conference Center, July 10-13th.
