

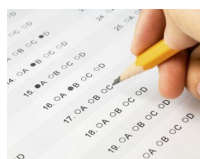

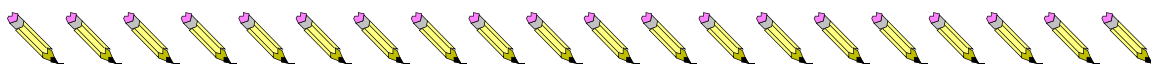

WEST VIRGINIA GENERAL SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENT

Wetzel County Schools will administer the West Virginia General Summative Assessment for Grades 3-8 in spring 2018 in the areas of English language arts (ELA), mathematics and science, May 6-24, 2019. This untimed test, which will be administered online, is used to measure academic progress for students and schools in West Virginia. All students enrolled in the grades identified below will participate in the West Virginia General Summative **Assessment** at the grade level in which they are enrolled, unless they meet the criteria for participation in the West Virginia Alternate Summative Assessment (DLM).

This year's test, which is a different test from the one given last year, will include four components:

- ELA Reading (grades 3-8)
- ELA Writing (grades 3-8)
- Mathematics (grades 3-8)
- Science (grades 5 and 8 only)

Student performance on the ELA reading and ELA writing components will be combined to obtain an overall ELA score. The results of the test provide information about a student's academic strengths and areas that need improvement. An Individual Student Report for each student will be sent to parents/guardians.



Wetzel County Technical Education Center to Offer Two Additional Programs in 2019-2020!

Beginning the fall of 2019, WCTEC will offer three programs to our high school students. In addition to welding, Wetzel County students will have the option to enroll in either the Electrical Technician or Diagnostic Services program.



Electrical Technician will prepare students for careers in the electrical field, such as commercial or residential wiring, and will study the national electric code. Students can continue on into fields such as petroleum technology or manufacturing as well.

Diagnostic Services is part of the Health Science program of study. This includes learning foundations of health science, electrocardiograph technician, and phlebotomy skills. This program is for anyone interested in a career in the health field. Students can continue on to earn their RN, PCT, CAN, LPN.

Our Students Are Our Sources of Strength

What does resiliency look like? Adult Advisors and Peer Leaders across Wetzel County identified, named, and defined their Sources of Strength while completing a two-day training in suicide prevention.

At the program's core, Sources of Strength is an upstream evidenced based suicide prevention program that increases help seeking behaviors, sharing stories of hope, help and strength, and connecting youth to trusted adults.

Trainings were held March 4th and 5th at the Mollohan Center in New Martinsville with participation from 15 Adult Advisors and 67 Peer Leaders.
